



DEMAZET VIGNOBLES

Created in 1952, Demazet Vignobles is the result of the two entities Terres d'Avignon cellars in Morieres-Les-Avignon and Canterperdrix in Mazan. Mazet is a Provençal term for a small house, Demazet is the result of the two small houses joining forces. Excellent growers with great regard for the environment, and source of top wines: Kermit Lynch fetches his Cotes Du Rhone Rouge from Demazet.

Cotes du Rhone Rouge Grande Selection “Cardinalices”:

Blend of 65% Grenache Noir, 20% Syrah, 9% (Counoise & Carignan), 6% Mourvèdre. Pebbly soil vineyards, traditional vinification. Coarse filtration before conditioning. Deep red in color, the nose exudes cherry and black fruit tones with touches of roasted meat, Provence herb spice and aromatics. Medium bodied on the palate, with the same flavors found in the nose, and a velvety, unctuous feel, and well-balanced refreshing finish between fruit, spice, meaty and mineral tones. A benchmark, true to type wine.

GIGONDAS “Chemin des Legendes”: 15.5% Alc. Blend of Grenache, Syrah & Mourvèdre. Hand harvested. Small Yields. Traditional vinification in temperature controlled Stainless steel vats for about 15 days, then second fermentation and ageing in demi-muids French oak vats. Super dark color, nose of garrigue, licorice, tar, dark berry fruit, black olives and leather. The wine is thick velvet on the palate, full bodied with the same flavors/aromas as the nose, and a powerful long finish coated with minerals. A Benchmark!
